rench knifemaker Fred Perrin drafted the
Spyderco/Perrin Fixed Blade to be utilitarian,
uncomplicated and capable. Perrin's background is multi-faceted. A former French Army
Commando, he has a slew of European martial
arts titles, conducts training seminars for elite
police units, is exceptionally talented at making knives and is
a dedicated husband and father.



The fixed-blade Perrin knife is a workhorse for hardcore chores. Shaped somewhere between a Bowie-style and clippoint style, the blade is 5 inches (127 mm) of flat-ground, 4mm thick VG-10 stainless steel. The handle is molded of high-impact fiberglass reinforced nylon (FRN) with rubbery Kraton side panels which put the skids on your hand slipping around while cutting. An index-finger notch on the underbelly of

the handle positions the forefinger at a spot where the knife is perfectly balanced. So precise is the 'sweet spot', the knife balances on your finger and draws and retrieves quickly without obstruction or hang-ups. A subtle down-



and his Laser Skills

pyderco uses a C₀₂ laser cutter. Why? This machine (close in size to a small delivery truck) produces a laser beam, which precisely cuts metal, G-10, and plastics to within 1/1000 of an inch tolerance. Having this equipment in-house allows Spyderco to control our level of quality to an amazing degree and go from a design idea in the mind, to a complete prototype knife in a single workday. External (blade and handles) and internal (locking bars) parts remain concordant in size and shape from the first run of a knife to the thousandth run. Twenty-five hundred pieces can run through the laser in a single shift keeping parts ready and on hand for assembly. The laser's ease of use and versatility allow it to jump from making Military Model parts to producing Gunting components in about thirty minutes.

Who runs this machine? Two forces actually, one human, one machine. Steve Oge joined Team Spyderco last year. As our Laser Technician he brings the experience of 26 years as a machinist with him. Steve controls/programs a CNC (computer numerical control) device driving the laser with digital direction and data. Steve may be a master of quality control but he's also an avid car enthusiast and antique fanatic. He and the manufacturing team have elevated Spyderco's American manufactured products to a level of quality that sets a standard in the cutlery industry.

Take A Turkey To Lunch

A handful of Spyderco rep groups sell product lines other than cutlery, some of these items are quite unique. Take for instance the deep frying turkey pot. Sharp and hungry rep groups have taken to marketing turkey fryers and Spyderco kitchen knives as a package to the backyard barbecue enthusiast. We were skeptical but decided to try it out October 19th. Spyderco management led by Chef Jeff Barhoover planned a company luncheon, brought in turkey frying pots and 'crisped a few birds'. Using **KO4** and **KO5 Spyderco kitchen knives** the birds where prepared and the jury was in. Incredible! Even cholesterol counters admitted the birds were non-greasy, crispy golden brown and juicy inside. A good lunch was gobbled (okay! What's a Cobra Hood?

The name inspires wacky visuals but no, a 'Cobra Hood' is not headgear for, venomous snakes. It's a machined flange of steel positioned over the round opening hole on a blade. The flange is textured along the top for better thumb grip and it directs/positions your thumb over the hole for rapid and precise opening of the knife blade. It's one of those slap my forehead "why didn't I think of that" uncomplicated designs which improves upon the simplicity of the opening hole. The name Cobra Hood is apt since it *does* physically resemble the shape of a ready-to-strike cobra's head. In coming months you'll see this feature on the **C70 ATR** and **C71** Salsa model CLIPITS.



Diamonds Can Be a Guy's Best Friend?

You ask, we listen. In year's past we've offered diamond coated speed sleeves as an accessory to our original sharpening system, the 203 Tri-Angle Sharpmaker. The 203 retired in 1998 making way for the **204 Tri-Angle Sharpmaker** and the diamond-coated sleeves were discontinued. We've since had numerous requests to bring them back. We'll again offer a diamond coated sharpening accessory, scheduled to arrive mid-2002. The new hollow metal rods are triangular and coated with microscopic diamond particles, perfect for aggressive sharpening. They fit into the existing 204-sharpener base and are sold separately from the 204 system. Contact your sales representative if you'd like more information.



The Phantom Lock—A MeerKat Mystery?

The new **C64 MeerKat** has a secret... Its pressure release blade-locking system baffles many people handling the model for the first time. To release the locked open blade, position your thumb on the butt end of the handle over the Spyderco bug. Put two fingers on the backside of the handle and scissor the two handle scales in opposite directions. This releases the locking mechanism, letting the blade close into the handle. Funny thing, once you've mastered the new lock you'll find you can't put the knife down.

C70 ATR: At-The-Ready

Always ready. Spyderco introduces the **At The Ready** or A.T.R. Designed by Sal Glesser it's loaded with high-tech features. It has an integrated Compression Lock and a 3½" blade of VG-10 or BG-42 stainless steel (blade steel will be decided upon once we're closer to production). A snub-nosed blade tip is thicker at the end amplifying strength and inviting hard use. Round holes in the titanium handle and clip lessen the overall weight and position the hand/fingers for 'indexing' the folder. This is one of our first models to feature the new Cobra Hood. The hood (cap) above the round hole guides the thumb precisely where it needs to be for quick opening of the blade. More details such as weight, overall length and MSRP will be announced soon. Call your sales person for more information.

C71 Salsa

Sort of a spiced-up overfed Navigator; the **Salsa** is a mighty-mite small knife that *thinks* it's a big blade. There are two Salsas actually. One version has colored anodized aluminum handle scales that house a Compression Lock inside, available in green, blue and khaki. It's complete with a heavy-gauge wire clip which rotates/fastens to either side of the knife for left and right handers alike. The second Salsa has a natural, titanium colored handle with an integral Compression Lock. Both flavors have a Spyderco Cobra Hood for rapid deployment of the blade. Blade length is 2½. The blade steel on the aluminum colored handle version will be AUS-8, the titanium version blade will be made of ATS-34. ¡Éste es caliente!

Jester JBK

Same size and stature as the Ladybug the **Jester** includes a couple new features. Texturing along the top of the blade above the round hole and at the tip favor intricate cutting by offering a grip position for your thumb and forefinger. The hollow-ground blade is AUS-6 steel, 1¹⁵/16" long and available in a PlainEdge or SpyderEdge. The Jester is one of the few 'clip-less' knives Spyderco produces and is designed to go on a keychain or inside a pocket. Available with a FRN (fiberglass reinforced nylon) handle in black, lime green or fuchsia, it'll be available mid-February 2002. A limited 1000 pieces of Jesters with a burgundy Micarta handles will be produced and available mid-January 2002 in a PlainEdge only.

FB05 Temperance Fixed-Blade/Trainer

The **Temperance Fixed-Blade** is a serious entry into the fixed-blade market. It's flat-ground 4 ½" blade is at home hunting, camping or in the kitchen. The FRN handle is molded with four dimples for indexing and rotation. Here's the dirt...Blade steel: VG-10, available PlainEdge or SpyderEdge, it's clip-less, accompanied by a Kydex belt sheath. Also available is a red handled trainer that is unsharpened and the same weight and size for realistic training.


